## COLLEGE BRIDGE PROGRAM

*The College Bridge program is a partnership between Kennedy-King College and the*

*Chicago Public Schools for high school Juniors and Seniors. The program provides an*

*Opportunity for students to earn college credit and high school credit in Illinois*

*Articulation Initiative Compliant General Education courses.*

*The college credits are transferable to four-year universities. There is no cost to the student. The requirements for participation are: 2.5 grade point average, excellent attendance and placement at the college level on the College Board Examination. Students must also have a signed high school referral form completed by the parents, the counselor and the principal.*

## STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES

**As a student participating in the College Bridge Program at Kennedy-King College you are afforded the opportunity to be treated as one of our regular college students. In addition, we expect that you adhere to all campus policies and procedures, as well the following items to ensure successful completion of the course in which you enroll.**

1. Attend class on a regular basis
2. Complete all assignments on time.
3. Be present, for, and take all tests, exams and quizzes.
4. Discuss any difficulty you are experiencing with your instructor.
5. Meet with the College Bridge Program Coordinator for consultation when requested.
6. Ask questions.
7. Utilize your support plan.
8. Notify your instructor if you are going to miss a class.
9. Officially withdraw from a class that you can no longer attend.
10. Be on time for class.

## BENEFITS

*College Bridge students receive both high school and elective/transferable college credits for one course per student per semester. Each course earns 1/2 high school credit at the course weight equivalent to Advanced Placement, Courses meet after regular instructional day,*
